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# Stronger Smarter Positive Behaviour Support at BNPS

Broome North Primary School is excited to continue its Stronger Smarter Positive Behaviour Support (SSPBS) journey. SSPBS is an evidence based, whole school approach to behaviour management. School behaviour expectations are clearly defined and taught and positive behaviour is rewarded and celebrated. It is a framework that will improve student academic and behavioural outcomes and ensures that all students have access to the most effective behavioural practices and interventions possible.

If a child doesn't know how to read, we teach  
 If a child doesn't know how to spell, we teach  
 If a child doesn't know how to multiply, we teach  
 If a child doesn't know how to behave, we...teach? Punish?  
 Shouldn't we be able to finish the last sentence as easily as the other 3?


As part of the SSPBS program, we will establish clear expectations for the behaviour we expect in all areas of our school. We will explicitly teach those expectations to the students and reward them frequently with positive notes and prizes for their great behaviour.

How does SSPBS help students and staff?

SSPBS builds a continuum of support for staff and students. Research shows that schools that implement the SSPBS framework with fidelity and consistency have better staff mental health and well-being, fewer students with behavioural problems, fewer suspensions and improved student academic results.

## Our Behaviour Expectations

Based on staff, student and parent input, our overarching theme is **Be Your Best**, and our whole school behaviour expectations are built around: **We are Respectful**, **We are Responsible** and **We are Resilient**.



## Behaviour Matrix and Teaching Expectations

The behaviour matrix is a detailed description of expected behaviour in each setting of the school. Throughout the school year, students will be taught how to behave according to our behaviour expectations. Teachers will help students learn what the expectations “look” and “sound” like in every setting during the school day. These lessons will be retaught and reinforced throughout the school year, and become a regular part of our instructional program.

## Besties

Acknowledging and reinforcing positive behaviour is one of the best ways to change inappropriate behaviour and encourage expected behaviour. “Besties” are given to students when they demonstrate positive behaviours, along with an explanation as to which behaviour expectation they have demonstrated. The use of a common language is central to the SSPBS process and is used by every member of the school staff when reinforcing expected behaviours. By earning “Besties,” students are able to work towards individual, class, block and whole school rewards (or incentives). They also go into the draw for a ticket to our Besties Brunch which is drawn at every assembly.





## Kabar Indonesia

Selamat datang! Last week we had many families come into the Indonesian classroom during our Learning Journey. Students in Nimunburr 1 and 2 were very proud to share their work and take their visitors on a tour around the classroom. It was great to see the students practising their Indonesian and teaching their family members a few words. The highlight for many students was sharing their traditional Indonesian game – the CONGKLAK (sometimes known as Congklak). The word congklak means mental calculation. The congklak is one of the oldest games in the world and was adapted from the mancala game by the Indonesian people. It is often made of teak wood which is elaborately carved into the various shape of birds. The object of the game is to steal all of your opponent's seeds. If you finish with the most seeds you shout out SAYA MENANG! (I won) Sampai jumpa!

## From the Dentist

Our Dental Therapy team will be screening Pre-primary, Year 3, Year 6 and any new or outstanding students at BNPS on Wednesday 14, November.

For those unfamiliar with the screening process – it is simply a growth and development check by our Dental Officer.

It is a legal requirement to screen patients every 3-4 years. Please note that dental screening is a very quick non-intrusive process and is not a dental examination. Only students who are enrolled with the School Dental Service will be screened. If you're unsure if you have completed dental enrolment forms please call to check. During the screening, children are lined up and simply need to bite their teeth together. The process takes approximately 5-10 seconds per child.

School Dental Services do not require parents to be present, however, if you wish to opt your child out of dental screening, please contact the clinic immediately to advise.


