Our Year 5/6 students attended Nyamba Buru Yawuru to view the Bugarrigarra Nyrdany: Because of the Dreaming exhibition and Liyan-Ngan Nyirrwa Wellbeing Centre.

On Tuesday, the students took part in damper making with their class and helped paint our new reading benches with Miss Jess and Ms Harris-Walker. These amazing benches will be placed outside the Library for our students to enjoy.

Students from Nimanburr block took a trip to Miniyurr Park on Wednesday to develop their understanding of the local area, stories, flora and fauna. This tour was presented by Jimmy Edgar and Bart Pigram of Narlijia Cultural Tours. Thursday was an activity filled day with our NAIDOC colour dress up, fun family activities session on the oval, more damper making, ochre painting and some story telling.

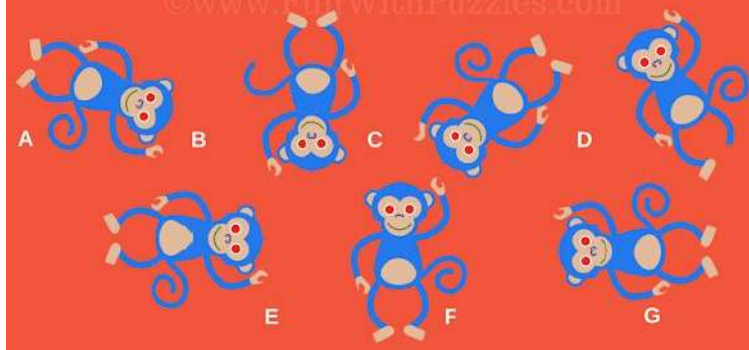
