House Swimming Carnival

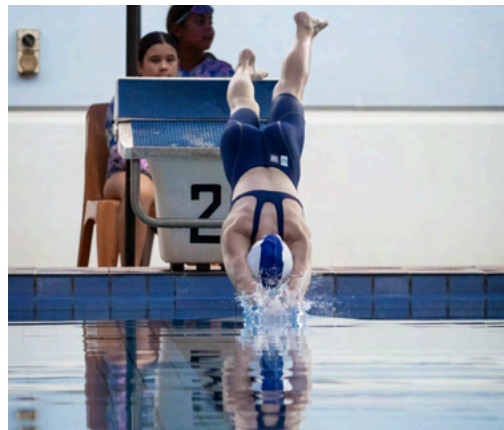
