Volunteer Appreciation Lunch – 5 December


To celebrate International Volunteer Day, we invited Board and P&C members and other people in our school community that have volunteered at the school throughout the year to share lunch as a thank you.

Under WA road safety laws, only individuals aged 16+ can use eRideables or eBikes with the motor engaged.

From the start of Term 1 2026 (2 February), eRideables and eBikes will not be permitted on school grounds by students under 16-years-old.

- One person per device
- Helmets required
- Age requirement: **16+**
- Bell or verbal warning
- Lights and reflectors required
- Speed on footpaths: **10**
- Speed on bike paths, shared paths and local roads: **25**
- No travel on roads: **>50**
