#### Year 6 Camp Week

Despite mask mandates, COVID closures, staffing changes/shortages and last minute alterations to plans, the Year 6 Camp got underway in Week 4. The 29 students and three staff spent the week based at the Broome Camp School for a series of onsite activities and town-based excursions designed to challenge the participants and build a sense of teamwork and empathy with their classmates. The challenges began early with students working in teams to create a tower of milk crates for another team member to climb. Some of the towers were as tall as a second story window! Other challenges included a fatbike ride through the sand dunes, archery (harder than it looks!) and a 3 storey rockwall climb. The students showed great resilience when faced with some of these challenges and were wonderfully supportive and encouraging of their peers.

Off-site excursions included a trip to the Malcolm Douglas Crocodile Park where everyone got the chance to hold a baby salt water crocodile, a boat trip on the bay with Broome Whale Watching, where we spotted a pod of snub-fin dolphins, turtles and a hammerhead shark. We also took in some of Broome's history with a visit to the museum, Town Beach park and playground, and The Pearl Luggers exhibit in town. Closer to the Camp School, we finished one of our days with an afternoon of beach activities, a camel ride and a sunset beach barbeque.

Our camp was a great success thanks to the efforts of our staff, the staff at the Camp School especially Mr Tom and the support of our parents who picked up and dropped off their children at the Camp School each day. Most importantly, our students, whose willingness to have a go at all the activities and support of one another, ensured the week was a valuable and memorable event.



We started the day with our Year 6 students racing a gruelling 2.5km track which included a huge sand dune, stairs, two ramps, sand and bush tracks. 












#### **Meet our School Board**

## Learning - Thriving - Leading

#### **Science Snippets with Mrs Carder**

This Term our Year 3 students have been learning about day and night during Earth and Space Science.

We have done several investigations to aid in our understanding by: following procedures; using props, models and role play; making observations; creating diagrams, tables and graphs; and drawing conclusions about our investigations.

To understand why the Moon and Sun appear the same size in our sky we used a tennis ball and basketball as props to represent the Moon and the Sun. We went to our oval and our observer on Earth had the student holding the Sun walk backwards until the Sun prop appeared the same size as the Moon. We are currently investigating why the length and direction of shadows change throughout the day by conducting a stick shadow investigation. We positioned a piece of paper on the ground and marked North. We then stuck a pop stick to the paper to create a shadow. Every 30 minutes one of our Year 3 classes measured the length and direction of the shadow by using a ruler and permanent marker to mark the length, direction and time of the shadow on the paper. Some of our Year 3s even came back during their lunch break to record one of our observations so we had consistent 30 minute readings of the shadow. For the remainder of the term we will analyse our data and draw conclusions about shadows, the sun, day and night.














### Music Notes with Miss T.

Each class is currently working on a NAIDOC week soundscape project as well as continuing to develop their understanding of instrument

playing and musical theory. Every year level is learning new songs regularly and these are used to discover multiple concepts in class.

The two choirs are ramping up to multiple performances this term and are working very hard to memorise their pieces. The senior choir is heading into the combined school's choir in Week 9, and we are very excited about this. The two BNPS choirs will combine for the closing ceremony of NAIDOC week.

Our Instrumental Music School Services program is having our first concert on Monday, Week 9 and parents of students performing are all welcome to come along (see the flyer for more information). Broome Brass Band is starting to make a good sound, and I am excited for what is coming next.

Barrganagunburu (in the time of Barrgana season) the beautiful garraly time, good time to go camping and wirliwirlingan walgawalgayi. We start to see yari on Broome's coastlines and mirdimarlu, nganarr and barrgara are fat and good to eat.

Bundurr blows from the south-east, on the odd occasions we experience mujungu and jaburr.

Broome North Primary students have been learning about Barrgana season and how to pronounce these Yawuru Ngan-ga, ask your children what these words mean!

Ngayu ngangaran wumbul juyu mabu liyan rumarra! I hope you have a good day!

This semester in Technologies, most classes in Years 2-4 have completed units on robotics.

The use of robotics allows students to practise their programming and algorithms with real-time feedback. If a robot does not behave as a student expects, they have to check the order of their instructions carefully to find any 'bugs' (errors) and correct any mistakes they find (a very important skill called 'debugging'). The robots created have all been built using 2 different styles of Lego robotics kits, WeDo and Mindstorms, targeted at different ages.

In Year 2, students have completed an introductory activity into robotics where they build a science discovery rover called Milo from the WeDo kits. They have learned to program a motor to start and stop operating when instructions are triggered from a motion or tilt sensor. In Year 3, students expand on this to build and test a race car that starts when they wave their hand in front of it, and stops when it senses it's approaching a wall. Year 4 students have stepped up to the more advanced Mindstorm kits with Lego Technic pieces, and explored a wider range of sensors such as light and colour sensors. Students have built a robot to follow a line that can navigate curves and correct its course as required.

Students in Linygurra 4, as well as the Year 5 and 6 students will get their turn to explore robotics next semester.


