Broome North PS has been lucky enough to be one of the recipients of an amazing grant. We have received \$2225 to go towards more Yawuru language being visible around the school in the form of signs on toilet doors, directional language on the four entry gates of the school, and most excitingly, signs that include interactive QR codes on the plants and trees throughout the school grounds that have significance to Yawuru culture. Students will be able to scan these QR codes and go to information on how these plants and trees are used and why they are important to Yawuru people.
