Please take a moment to look through the term planners, read the most recent news from the Parents and Citizens Association (P&C), and keep an eye on the school calendar, which is available on our website.

The administrative team would like to gently remind everyone of a few crucial matters to ensure the well-being and smooth operation of our school community:

Student Safety:

- If your child uses a bike or scooter, kindly ensure they wear helmets.
 Safety first!
- When picking up or dropping off, please adhere to designated areas and avoid crossing roads hastily on Tanami and Nakamura roads.
- Gates will be locked at 2:30 pm. Remember, school premises, including the oval, become off-limits after this time.
- We understand public parks as a way of having a break from the kids is a quick and easy option, but please remember that parks might not always be the safest places for our kids. Supervision is always recommended.

School Reminders:

- Let's ensure our students are dressed according to the school uniform guidelines. Daily attire includes school shirts, black or blue shorts, a wide-brim hat, and enclosed shoes. Wednesdays are reserved for sports shirts.
- If your child has shoulder-length or longer hair, we encourage it to be tied back. It can get caught and cause harm, like earrings and necklaces, so we recommend stud earrings and tuck jewellery into shirts.






