Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

BNPS is a PBS school

What is PBS?

Positive Behaviour Support

PBS is a framework for implementing a continuum of evidence-based interventions to achieve positive academic, social, emotional and behaviour outcomes for all students.

A major component of this framework is teaching and reinforcing positively stated expected behaviours.



Besties

At BNPS we use Besties to acknowledge and reinforce expected behaviour. We use the PBIS Rewards online system to give out Bestie Points. Bestie points are given when students demonstrate the whole school expected behaviours. These behaviours come from our Matrix and fall under 'We are Respectful', 'We are Responsible', 'We are Resillent'.

Lessons are taught once a week for each behaviour expectation. Each week, a 'What's on at BNPS' page goes on Seesaw, the school Facebook page and is on the school noticeboards. At the top it says our whole school behaviour focus.



Whole School Rewards

At BNP5 students are rewarded for their respectful, responsible and resilient behaviour with Individual, whole class and whole school rewards. This is linked with our Bestle points and expected behaviours.

At assemblies, the BESTIE BONANZA winners are announced. Students from each block are picked randomly, who have received lots of besties. They then get to go to a Bestie Bonanza This is usually held in the Library on a Finday afternoon and involves games, iPads and treats.

VVe also find out at assemblies, how close we are to our whole school bestie target, looking at the thermometer below. If we meet our target by VVeek 10, we get a whole school reward. This could include an extra long playtime, waterplay, fun rotations of outdoor activities etc.

Last term, we achieved our whole school target.

As our reward, we went to the oval with a buddy year level (Year 1 and 4, 3 and 5, year 2 and 6) and participated in tug of war, egg and spoon and sack races, rob the nest game and glant games and reading, it was so awesome to see the bigger kids helping out and having fun with the younger kids!
