PBS Update

Positive Behaviour Support

PBS is a framework for implementing a continuum of evidence-based interventions to achieve positive academic, social, emotional and behaviour outcomes for all students.

A major component of this framework is teaching and reinforcing positively stated expected behaviours.

At the beginning of this year, staff completed a survey which gives us a snapshot of the staff's perception of how PBS is being implemented at BNPS. The survey is called the Self-Assessment Survey (SAS).

From the survey we have celebrated areas where we have scored above 80% and looked at areas for improvement.

Celebrations

- Expected student behaviour and routines are stated clearly and positively and taught directly. They apply to non-classroom settings.
- All staff are involved directly and/or indirectly in school-wide interventions (like teaching and rewarding behaviour) and management of non-classroom settings.
- Significant family and/or community members are involved when appropriate and possible.

We've gone paperless!

At BNPS we use Besties to acknowledge and reinforce expected behaviour. This Semester, we have been trialing the PBIS Rewards online system to give out Bestie Points rather than the paper ticket. The staff at BNPS have found this a lot more convenient and beneficial in the implementation and tracking of the PBIS framework within the school. We are going to continued with PBIS Reward's online system in 2023.

At BNPS students are rewarded for their respectful, responsible and resilient behaviour with individual, whole class and whole school rewards. This is linked with our Bestie Points and

expected behaviours.

Whole Class Reward: Treasure Hunt

On Monday, our class attended the Year 6 High School orientation, to give us a feel for what High School is like. I was really looking forward to the whole thing. After the bus ride, we gathered in the school gym and separated into 8 groups. It was very noisy, everyone from all the schools chatting at once. I was in group 7. Our group's first class was a tour of the Arts block. We went into the Drama room, the Music room and the Visual Arts room. Then we went to the Food Tech room, where we made mini pizzas and talked a bit about what you can do in the classes. At the next class, Woodwork, we made wooden phone stands. We hammered the wooden blocks together and then burned a design on them. In English class we did a Kahoot quiz and watched a video. My favourite class was Science. We did a lot of different experiments, displaying different types of science. We mixed chemicals, made a paperclip stick to a balloon, made elephant's toothpaste and made a hydrogen bomb explode! In Sport we played dodge ball to warm up, then we split into teams to play multisports.

It was a great day! The thing I'm most looking forward to is the science classes where we will get to do real experiments. I am also looking forward to having a bigger range of subjects to do, and moving to different classes.

Students created an egg parachute by following a procedure we had read and discussed in class, then we conducted the experiment. After many failed attempts and broken eggs, we went back and spoke about how we could have made the procedure more clear by using better and more specific language, ensuring a better end result.











Multi Sports Carnival

On Friday the 28th of October, 40 of our students competed against other West Kimberley schools in the Multi-sports carnival at the BRAC. Students in Year 3 and 4 participated in soccer on the outdoor courts, while our Year 5 and 6 students took part in a Round Robin cricket carnival on Father McMahon oval. A new event was added to the program this year with four of our Year 5 and 6 students participating in a tennis competition. The soccer matches were played using the "Dog and Bone" format which students really enjoyed and allowed them to have a lot of game time. Their enthusiasm and shouts of encouragement could be heard all the way over at the oval! Our cricketers played with a lot of resilience (and sunscreen), playing back-to-back games for the entire carnival. Our tennis players finished the day second out of eight schools and were presented with caps and medals. There was a lot of talent on display with many of our students smashing boundaries, bowling wickets and taking impressive catches. Our girls cricket team won many of their games and our boys' team was undefeated! All our students displayed fantastic sportsmanship and thoroughly enjoyed the day.

Get in early in case we sell out.


We will stop selling at 6.15pm sharp to allow our members to make their way up to the oval and get seated ready for the show at 6.30pm.
