### **Spelling Mastery**

This year Broome North Primary School has implemented and trialled Spelling Mastery under the support and guidance of the Kimberley Schools Project (KSP). Spelling Mastery approaches spelling through strategies, patterns and rules. The straightforward lessons in Spelling Mastery combine phonemic, morphemic, and whole-word instruction to make spelling easier to learn, leading the way to more effective writing. Spelling Mastery interweaves these three approaches according to students' skill development and provides lessons to help efficiently and effectively teach the spelling skills students need to become proficient readers and writers. Explicit instruction, careful selection of spelling words, and repeated and cumulative practice help students master each concept and reinforce and retain key information. Spelling Mastery books will be on the booklist for 2020, as a voluntary charge, and we encourage as many parents as possible to contribute an extra \$27.95 so that the school can purchase the books for your child. Broom North PS has made some amazing progress in literacy this year, as evident in our NAPLAN results. We have been very fortunate to have the KSP fund Spelling Mastery this year; as we have seen some great results across the school whilst implementing the program and it will continue next year. We would appreciate your support in covering the cost of the Spelling Mastery student book as an additional charge to the booklist.




### Kabar Indonesian


