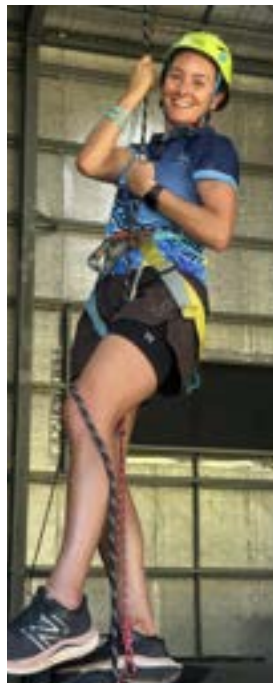

## Year 1 Science News with Ms Carder

Year 1s have been learning that water is a natural resource and is used by people, animals and plants in different ways. While learning about the water cycle, students conducted an investigation into how clouds make rain by creating a model using a glass jar, shaving cream and water with blue food dye. They observed that when the cloud was heavy with water, it began to rain. They have been learning to pronounce and explain what evaporation, condensation and precipitation is while undertaking hands-on activities to deepen their understanding of the water cycle and water uses.

## Year 3 Science News with Ms Carder

The Year 3s have been studying how soils, rocks and minerals are important Earth resources. They have collected various soil samples from around the school and used sieves to separate the components by size. They have explored the differences between sand, silt and clay and undertaken soil ribbining to determine what type of soil sample they collected. Students are now learning about rocks and minerals. They have cracked open a geode and explored the properties of rocks and minerals by conducting tests such as hardness, reactivity, porosity, and magnetism.

## N3 and N4 Science News with Ms Carder

Students have been exploring how weathering, erosion and deposition cause changes to the Earth's surface. They recently conducted an investigation where they constructed a model of a coastline to test the effectiveness of sea walls as an erosion mitigation strategy. Students learned that using natural resource such as rocks in vulnerable coastal area and vegetation on sand dune helps stabilise the coastline and prevent weathering and erosion.

## GRIT for Student Leaders

Earlier this term, our Student Leaders took part in the YouthCARE GRIT Program, which is a social and emotional learning program that uses experiential learning activities, games, and reflection to build resilience, teamwork, communication, leadership, problem solving, and self-awareness in young people. The program helps students develop the skills to confidently manage challenges and change. GRIT is commonly used to support leadership development, social skills, resilience, and community building. The program aligns with the Western Australian Curriculum and is facilitated by trained teachers

## Drawing Tips!

Here's how to get the best result for your child's beautiful artwork.

- ✔ Use **strong, bright** marker pens, paints, craft dyes and good quality photos. You don't have to use special pens, just make sure the colours are bright and bold.
- ✔ Don't use pencils, crayons, metallics, fluoros or glitter. These don't show up very well on the finished product.
- ✔ Draw **inside the drawing area** marked on the template. We do our best, but up to 2cm can get trimmed off from one or more edges during manufacture, so make sure to keep important names and dates away from the edge.
- ✔ Write your **child's name** in the box in the top right corner, and write the number of copies you'd like in the box below. Some drawing paper templates are used for more than one product, so make sure you are filling out the right box.
- ✔ Photos should be glued in place well. Large, bright close-ups are best as they will slightly blur and darken during manufacture.
- ✔ Some products may have **features** like clock hands or calendar hangars inside the drawing area. Be aware of these when placing your photos—nobody wants a clock mechanism between the eyes!
- ✔ Any marks in the drawing area may show up on the final product. Rub out any pencil marks properly, or use a fresh sheet of drawing paper.
- ✔ Don't roll, fold or crease the paper. Keep it flat and free from damage.
